Summer Programs

Mission Statement

The Mission of Bear Lake Camp is to develop leadership skills, build confidence, and to provide a premier outdoor educational and recreational experiences year-round to all persons, regardless of ability.

Bear Lake Camp is a Summer Adventure for:

Blind & Visually Impaired

Bear Lake Camp offers a one-week session for youth with visual impairments. The session is developed and coordinated by a teacher of the blind and visually impaired. Key to the success of our program is having lots of fun. While they are having fun, they are developing self-concepts and social skills. The programs are also designed to support the development of orientation and mobility, independence with daily living skills. Campers are also introduced to outdoor recreation skills with a focus in independent mastery of skill. We welcome communication with parents to support or encourage specific skills and/or techniques they are currently focusing on.

Leadership Development

This is a special program for both deaf & hard of hearing and blind & visually impaired youth, ages 15-16 who are past campers. Leadership abilities, skills and attitudes are explored relative to the camp experience. The program runs for two summers. Campers that are interested in becoming a staff member of Bear Lake Camp are highly encouraged to sign up.



Deaf & Hard of Hearing

These sessions are for children who use listening and spoken language as their primary mode of communication. Youth Session is a one week long for campers age 6-15. Campers will have fun, swimming, kayaking, canoeing, nature, outdoor games, archery, showtime, journal writing, overnight tent camping and the challenge course, while we build vocabulary and use good language to communicate with others.

Family Session is a weekend camp for families of deaf & hard of hearing youth. For parents, relevant topics are provided by special presenters and opportunities to network with other parents while children are led by qualified staff. Every evening is full of fun family activities.
